Element #1: Quality Rehabilitation and Redevelopment

Provides places for needed uses that are complimentary to the existing context and contribute to creating a sense of place.



Element #2: Community Character

Maintains and expands community character through physical improvements and events.



Element #3: Mixture of Uses

Provides a mix of uses so there are many reasons to be in the district while also enlivening activity nodes and pedestrian routes.





Creates a connected system of pedestrian routes that are easy and pleasant to use and accessible to everyone.

Element #5: Amenities and Services

Maintains and expands these uses to meet the everyday needs of those living in the District while also activating civic life.





Element #6: Density and Compactness

Creates districts that are functional, active, safe and accessible to pedestrians by keeping uses close together.



Element #7: Open Space

Provides a variety of spaces, both passive and active that support: quiet moments to stroll, read, think and dream; gather with friends and family; or to partake in athletic pastimes.



Element #8: Mixture of Transportation Modes

Provides many ways to get around a district and to other districts.



Element #9: Economic Vitality

Creates economic vitality through an affordable mix of uses and travel modes, as well as active support of a mix of both small/local and larger businesses.
